Virtual Presentation Guidelines

For those who want to present virtually, please refer to the instructions below.

The SANER 2023 virtual session is an excellent opportunity for the global software engineering community to learn about your research. SANER 2023 virtual meeting platform will allow you to **post your abstract, poster, and a pre-recorded video presentation in advance of the conference and present your paper on your Zoom Live session on March 21-24, 2023.**

What do I need to do before the conference?

You will receive an email from SANER 2023 with a link to build your virtual poster exhibit in Whova, which must be completed by **March 5, 2023 (AoE)**. Your exhibit will be made available to conference attendees leading up to - and throughout - the conference, and after the conference.

Each virtual presentation must include three components, which are explained in the following paragraphs:

- Research highlights.
- A pre-recorded video summarizing your poster and
- A PDF file whatever you want to share with others.

Length of Video Recording

- Research: 17 min
- Journal First Track: 17 min
- RENE: 17 min
- Industry: 7 min
- ERA: 7 min
- Tools: 7 min

Note that you can revisit your virtual presentation exhibit at any time to make updates prior to the **March 5, 2023 (AoE)** deadline.

1. Research highlights

In Whova, using the 'Description/Abstract' section of your virtual poster exhibit, provide a few highlights about your research. Highlights are three to five bullet points that help readers to efficiently grasp the nature and scope of your research. Keep each bullet point brief as it is not expected that you capture the entirety of your research approach and conclusions in these highlights (max. 200 characters).

2. pre-recorded video summarizing your research

The purpose of this pre-recorded video is for conference attendees to watch an overview of your paper on demand, throughout the conference. Recording a video presentation is easy - all you need is a copy of your presentation slides, a webcam, and a microphone. A well-lit, quiet location to record your video is highly recommended.

The following resources describe how to record directly in [PowerPoint \[link; 6m44s\]](#) or by using [Zoom \[link; 1m35s\]](#). If you record in PowerPoint, files must be exported and saved with a resolution of **HD (720P)**. Full or Ultra HD **must not be used**, which will exceed the file size limit in Whova.

If you failed to upload the video, please send your videos to saner2023@iccmacao.com we will upload it on your behalf.

A video presentation is a fast-paced and fun way to share your research and encourage questions from the audience. Here are some tips as you prepare your video:

- Keep your presentation simple by limiting the number of slides and displaying only key figures, summary graphics or a few bullet points.
- Make sure all images and text are legible.
- Explain your project rationale and research questions, what you did/plan to do, and what you found/expect to find.
- Include a 'hook' that captures the attention of the audience and leaves them wanting more.

- End your video by encouraging viewers to ask a question in the chat and visit you during your poster session.
- Practice, practice, practice! and
- Have fun!

In the 'Upload Document' section of your virtual presentation exhibit, add a title and upload the PDF.
